



## Who is eligible?

### DO YOU FISH, LOG OR FARM?

Children under the age of 20 (22 with an IEP) who accompany their parents or guardians during seasonal fishing, farming or logging may be eligible for Migrant Education services.

Children, ages 14 and over, who participate in the migrant work activity may also qualify.

The program recruiters interview families to determine if their students qualify for program services. To contact a recruiter, call 907-874-2347.



## Parental Involvement

Parent participation is a major component of the Migrant Education Program. Parents are the first and most important teachers of their children. They are role models for values, principles and conduct.

The Migrant program will hold parent nights and training sessions to better equip parents for supporting their child's education at home.

# What is Migrant Education

The Migrant Education Program serves students who travel outside the Wrangell Public School District borough boundaries to engage in seasonal fishing or agricultural activities. The usual activity of families in the Wrangell area is fishing and can be either commercial or subsistence.

The Migrant Education Program is federally funded and provides resources, services and activities for Migrant children and their families.

Our goal is to help migrant children develop to their fullest academic and social potential, and to provide learning opportunities for success in life. These goals will assist students in becoming self-sufficient members of our community.

## Program Goals:

- To integrate and support existing educational services
- To identify and assess individual family needs and assist in developing an appropriate action plan
- To provide opportunities for reading readiness for pre-school through grade three.
- To provide opportunities for developing family literacy.

Program activities are available to eligible children 3-20 years.

## Services Offered

**Tutoring Services:** Tutors are available, during the school day, at Evergreen Elementary School and Stikine Middle School. Additional tutoring can be arranged after school and during the evening as needed.

**Supplemental Instruction in the Classroom:** A teacher is available during the school day to provide remedial skills to students who are in danger of not meeting the state standards.

**Books & Magazine Subscriptions:** Migrant students will receive books and magazines to promote reading and literacy in the home.

**iPads:** iPads may be available for checkout to migrant students to provide educational and remedial applications and to assist them with research projects.

**Tuition Assistance for Concurrent Enrollment College Courses:** Funds are available to assist migrant students with college tuition for courses taken during high school.
